The square-cum-parvis of the Church of Santa Lucia, in the centre of Bologna, offers an unexpected spectacle. In the second half of the sixteenth century Pope Pius IV gave the small parish church of S. Lucia to the Jesuits, so that they might make it the centre of their spiritual formation activities.

In 1623, they commissioned the Rome architect Girolamo Rainaldi to draw up plans that respected the congregation's needs, in order to facilitate their teaching work. The reconstruction was interrupted several times prior to 1835, then a citizens' committee raised funds by public subscription and put the architect Angelo Venturoli in charge of the project, who, for financial reasons, completed the main nave with an apse that was narrower than the one previously left unfinished. In 1866, the church was deconsecrated and became the property of the Bologna City Council. In 1988, on occasion of the celebrations for the 9th Centenary of the University of Bologna, the church was rehabilitated as the University's Aula Magna (Great Hall) and various other rooms.
